Proposed meeting order for the autumn 24 guild assembly Background

The Board, in consultation with the Nomination Committee, the Guild assembly speaker and the President of the Committee For Student Equality, has chosen to present a proposal that retains large parts of the proposed meeting order from the spring semester 2024 with minor changes to make the process more efficient and clear. The changes from VT24 are as follows:

• Remove time indications for motions & propositions and for end of discussion.

The nominations are announced

- Clarify when the time for counter-nomination closes.
- Clarify when floor candidacy applies in the event that a candidate does not accept the nomination of the Nomination Committee.
- Allows discussion of candidates in the event that floor candidacy is allowed, as long as a member requests it.

We therefore propose

that discussion time for motions & propositions starts with time allocated to questions only.

that in cases where the motioner agrees with the Board's motion response, only the motion response is presented.

that candidates nominated by the Nomination Committee and candidates who have notified a counter-nomination to the Nomination Committee after the Nomination Committee's nominations are announced and no later than November 15, 23:59 are entitled to stand for election. This is at least 48 hours after the Nomination Committee's nominations are announced and the candidacy deadline is lifted. The nominated candidates and those who have filed a counter-nomination will be published for the section before the meeting.



- that floor nominations are only allowed for those positions for which the Nomination Committee has no full proposal. Floor nominations are also allowed if fewer candidates accept the Nomination Committee's nomination than the limit for the position.
- that if floor candidacy is allowed, the floor is opened for discussion if a member requests it. During discussion, all candidates must leave the room. The request for discussion must be made after the last speech for the candidates but before the meeting goes to the vote.
- that each candidate has the opportunity to present themselves for a maximum of 3 minutes, after which the floor is opened for questions. In total, the presentation and questions may take a maximum of 7 minutes.
- that in the case of a floor candidacy, an additional 3 minutes for questions shall be added to the total presentation time for all candidates in that election.
- that the Nomination Committee has the right to ask the first 3 questions.
- that the candidates have the right to choose a person to speak on their behalf. The candidate nominated by the Nomination Committee has the right to ask the Nomination Committee to speak for the candidate.
- that the speeches for the candidates take place after all presentations for a positions have been made. The candidate may be present during the speech if desired.
- that the speeches for candidates may last a maximum of 3 minutes.
- that these guidelines can be changed if the meeting feels it is necessary. A change to the guidelines requires a 2/3 majority.
